# The meeting broke for supper


#### Lecture:

Kathy introduced Gary Hodder for a presentation Orchids for new growers.

Gary started by reminding members of the huge numbers of orchid species and manmade nothogenus. Orchids have many habitats and media to grow both on & in these are Lithophytic growing on rocks especially in crevices where leave and other humic matter accumulates, Epiphytic these are orchids that

grow on Trees and survive like Lithophytic orchids from similar humic accumulates and finally Terrestrials that grow in soft loamy sandy open soils. All have a need for fungal interaction.

It was noted that species don't have to be exclusively one type. Gary noted that Den speciosum can be both Lithophytic & Epiphytic. The mentioned that orchids can be either Monopodial or Sympodial. Monopodial are Vandacious that grow upwards like a tree fern. Sympodial are bulb like with nutrient storage in pseudobulbs.



Gary then showed various habitats from Costa Rica to Cambodia

The next item he advised on how you increase your orchid collection. There are several options the easiest option is to purchase orchids from reputable nurseries or growers novice growers should buy established plants but as you advance purchase of Flasks is a way to get unique plants. The next option is to divide your current orchids. The other is via Kikis. Gary spoke of how in Asia they get old canes of Dendrobiums to form Kikis and showed the results by cutting and hanging upside down. Gary then explained all the down sides of insect pests and the 33 known viruses and fungi that harm your orchids.

If repotting to create specimens that only increate pot size up by one size don't go crazy and double the pot size. And always ensure you repot when plant is going to grow more new roots What you grow your orchids in or on is problematic from Squat pots, Timber, Coir lined Baskets, Waterwells, terracotta to Slab culture on Cork, tree fern and Hard Wood. Then there is all sorts of growing media Pine Bark, Hard Wood Charcoal, Scoria, Crushed Limestone, Mosses such as Sphagnum & Bush and Hydroponically using Rock wool and like materials. You should be aware of the Tannis & phenols that are in some bark that are poisonous to some orchids.

Speaking of fertiliser, you need to be aware slow-release fertilisers are affected by heat make them break down faster. Also, the NPK ratios need for flowering initiation vs Growth should be considered. The use of Epsom Salts (Magnesium sulfate) 75g to 100 litres and Condy's Crystals (potassium permanganate) 5g to 100 ltrs these should be used to dose your plants twice a year.

With watering remember to never water above 27°C or below 10°C. If temperature is above 27°C don't water the plant but the floor to create humidity and air movement Kathy thanked Gary for his informative talk.

# Not another one changed!!

At our spring show, my eye was attracted to an old intergeneric hybrid that was benched.

Back in the early 1980's Howeara genus was all the rage as the new pot plant orchid took the world by storm with the new intergeneric hybrid Howeara Mini-Primi, with its deep red flowers on a compact plant. It was just Wow!

I looked at the results and noticed the genus name had changed. Yep, the botanists are at it again!

In 1976 Stephen E Howe of Miami Florida USA, registered the <u>nothogenus</u>, after himself, the three genera were *Leochilus*, *Oncidium* and *Rodriguezia* (Lchs. × Onc. × Rdza.).

The first part of the cross made by Dr Ruben P Sauleda of Goulds, Florida USA in 1970 and was Oncidium sarcodes being the seed parent and Rodriguezia lanceolata being the pollen parent, he named this cross Rodricidium Primi. Then in 1976 Stephen E Howe added Leochilus oncidioides as the pollen parent to Rodricidium Primi as the seed parent to make Howeara Mini-Primi.

But, as they say never leave anything alone or allow growers to become too familiar with a Genus name, and so in 2009 everyone's Favorite Botanist Mark.W.Chase collaborated with Norris Hagan Williams, changed Oncidium sarcodes to Gomesa sarcodes With this name change came the name changes for all the hybrids and Rodricidium Primi became Gomguezia Primi with that name change Howeara became extinct. The new name for the Genus became Leomesezia.

Leomesezia Lava Burst heritage is Leomesezia Mini-Primi crossed back to it Grandfather Rodriguezia lanceolata. Lsz. Lava Burst 'Puanami' has 2 Awards of Merit from American Orchid Society and 3 Certificates of Cultural Merit including one with listed as having 17 inflorescence & with some racemes having over 19 flowers. The clonal name was registered in 1993 by Gavin J Yamada of Puanami Orchids, Waimanalo, Hawaii, USA hence the clonal name.
